Question of the Week

Friendships are incredibly important to my daughter but girls can fall out. What can school and parents do to support our daughters?

Answer: We recognise that having a friend is the most important aspect of a girl's life and as they get older it becomes impossible for adults to effectively solve friendship issues for them. To help the girls with this, we have become a Girls On Board school, and Mrs Moss and Mrs Mackle have been trained as Girls on Board Champions. Girls on Board is an approach that helps girls understand the complexities of girl friendships and gives them the language and skills to solve many of their own friendship problems.



In the next few weeks, we will be running a Girls on Board session with all the girls in Year 4-6 to introduce them to the language and approach. Staff will also be trained. There is also a Parent Guide that we will be sending out to you so you can support the work in school. This will then become a very useful tool for parents and staff when handling friendship concerns.

Of course, we take bullying incredibly seriously and any concerns about bullying should be discussed with the Class Teacher who will refer it to Mrs Moss.

We will also be looking how to adapt our Girls on Board training to the needs of boys, as friendships are very valuable for them too. Watch this space!
